For the first 24 hours he was given physical therapy every 4 hours and was attended by three specialists. Treatment was then cut to twice a day for the remaining stay in the hospital.

This, of course, is only a part of the service that is being rendered to all sufferers of Polio. In view of this The Precisioneers as a group is making a donation and we are sure that many of you will want to make an additional contribution.
