

Logic Design, Product Design, the CADS System, Parts Listing, Value Liaison Engineering, Test Equipment Design, Component Engineering, and Production Control.

"Everyone should be moved in by early March," said Bill Girouard, Manager, Industrial Engineering. "We will begin move-in operations during the week of the plant shutdown."

Seventy-six employees donated blood during the Company's blood drive held in October. The total pints of blood donated by Librascope employees during 1983 was 156.

According to the American Red Cross, more than 1,000 patients in over 220 hospitals in the Los Angeles and Orange counties need blood every day, and to meet this commitment, the Red Cross must recruit more than 400,000 donors a year, about 8,000 a week!

The next Company blood drive will be held in May, 1984. Anyone who would like to donate before that time, can make an appointment by calling the Red Cross.

A Reminder For A Safe Holiday

The December holiday season, while replete with the pleasures of a joyous period, also is a season of high accident hazards and, to help reduce the accident potential, the National Safety Council has issued a series of suggestions on greater holiday safety both in driving and in the home.

For holiday safety at home, make certain that all toys purchased for children are safe . . . incapable of causing shock, fire or explosion. Also assure that toys purchased for toddlers cannot be swallowed, either whole or in part.

Trimming Christmas trees and preparing the holiday meal can both be disasterous if precautions are not taken while using ladders and while cooking.

In your holiday driving ... drive defensively ... observe the speed limits, and don't drive if tired or if you've been drinking! REMEMBER more than one-half of all traffic fatalities in December involve drinking drivers.

ALSO REMEMBER . . . the six hours of Christmas Eve are the most deadly period of the holiday, with the hourly rate for fatal accidents approximately five times greater than for the balance of the holiday.
