AN/BSY-2 Display Software Delivered ...

A significant AN/BSY-2 program milestone was reached on November 30, with the successful acceptance testing of Drop 1 of the Virtual Device Interface (VDI) software. This first drop provides generic display functionality so that applications programmers at various AN/BSY-2 sites can develop specific display formats. With two more drops of the VDI scheduled early next year, the AN/BSY-2 team will have the most advanced display software capability in the world.

The successful completion of this software drop was accomplished by the coordinated efforts of many people. In particular, the effort of Dan Jones, who was assigned the role of Test and Integration Director, was instrumental in reaching this major program milestone.

New Item Added to FICA Taxes

The tax base for FICA (Social Security) will be increased for 1991. In addition, the tax rate for SDI (State Disability Insurance) has also increased.

Valerie Klein, Supervisor, Payroll, said that the new rate and bases will be reflected in the first checks issued to employees in January.

A new item has been added to the FICA taxes starting in 1991. The Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990, passed by Congress on October 27, 1990, has created a separate and higher wage base for Medicare purposes, beginning in 1991.

The 1991 FICA social security taxable wage base will be \$53,400, an increase of \$2,100 over the 1990 base of \$51,300. The new 1991 Medicare taxable wage base ("Hospital Insurance" portion) will be \$125,000. Tax rates for an employee's wages for 1991 will be 6.2% for social security and 1.45% for the Medicare/Hospital Insurance portion of the tax, and a matching amount from the employer.

For SDI purposes, the tax base will be \$31,767 in 1991. The new SDI rate is 1.0% as compared to 0.9% for 1990. The maximum amount of SDI tax payable by an employee will be \$317.67. This is \$91.33 more than the \$226.34 maximum paid in 1990.

W-2 Forms To Be Mailed

In January, the Company will be mailing W-2 forms to all employees for their use in filing income tax returns. Employees are reminded to make sure their correct mailing address is on file with the Company. For a change of address form, contact your department secretary, or the Personnel Records Office, Bldg. 3.

Paychecks Available During Holiday

Payroll checks for the week ending December 23 will be available for pick up during the plant closure on Friday, December 28, in the Bldg. 3 Lobby, between 9 am and 11 am.

The usual distribution of payroll checks for week ending December 30 will be made on Friday, January 4, 1991.


New Hours For Credit Union


